4.1 Description of first aid measures Eye contact Get medical attention immediately. Call a poison center or physician. SECTION 7: Handling and storage

7.1 Precautions for safe handling

Protective measures	: Put on appropriate personal protective equipment (see Section 8). Persons with a history of skin sensitization problems should not be employed in any process in which this product is used. Do not get in eyes or on skin or clothing. Do not breathe vapour or mist.
