This is a three component polyamine cured zinc rich epoxy coating. It is a high solids, high zinc dust containing product. It conforms to the compositional requirements of SSPC paint 20, level 2 and ISO 12944-5. It provides very good corrosion protection as part of a complete coating system. To be used as primer in atmospheric environments. Suitable for carbon steel, repair of inorganic zinc silicate coating and damaged galvanized steel substrates. This product complies with ASTM D520 type II zinc dust.

Suitable for structural steel and piping to be exposed to highly corrosive environments, C5 (ISO 12944-2). Recommended for offshore environments, refineries, power plants, bridges, buildings, mining equipment and general structural steel. Specially designed as a primer for coating systems where extended durability is required.

Dried/cured for service: Minimum time before the coating can be permanently exposed to the intended environment/medium.
